The master's degree program in Gender Studies, the first one ever in the NIS, was launched at the EHU in 2000, and, at the same time, it opened up a new dimension of the EHU's academic programs. In academic year 2001-2002 several new master's degree programs will be started. These include master's degree programs in European and Transatlantic Studies, Public Administration and NGO Management, Religious Studies, Philosophy and others.

In 2001-2002 the EHU starts a new MBA program in cooperation with *The Institute of Privatization and*

Management, Minsk, Belarus, and Leon Kosminski Academy of Entrepreneurship and Management, Warsaw, Poland. This program is developed with support of the Central Connecticut State University, USA.
